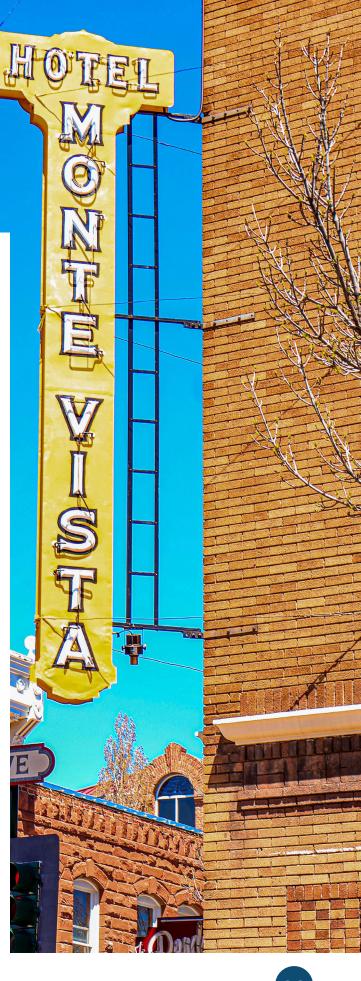
### MISSION STATEMENT

# **TIMELINE**

This year, ParkFlag made several key improvements to better serve our community and enhance operational efficiency:

# APRIL **2024**

In response to a rise in repeat offenders using parking without payment, immobilization processes were implemented to deter continued use of prime parking spaces by non-payers.

# **2024**

Fully Electric Fleet: ParkFlag is now fully electric with

the addition of a Chevy Silverado for enforcement and maintenance, underscoring our commitment to

sustainability.

# **2024**

Our internal software was updated, including a new, user-friendly customer-facing permit portal to simplify permit management.

#### **JULY**

2025

Launched a new, mobile-optimized ParkFlag website with updated maps to provide better access to information and services for the public.

# SPECIAL REVENUE FUND

ParkFlag is a program by the City of Flagstaff. We are committed to providing excellent service. ParkFlag is a special revenue fund- all expenses related to running the program are funded by the revenues collected in Pay to Park.

#### **Dedicated Use of Funds**

Revenue collected through ParkFlag is exclusively allocated to the operation, maintenance, and improvement of the parking district. These funds cannot be diverted to other City departments, initiatives, or services outside of the district.

## Investment in Future Parking Solutions

A minimum of 20% of gross parking revenues be placed into a separate reserve fund, commonly referred to as the "lockbox." This fund is specifically designated for the acquisition and development of additional parking infrastructure to meet growing demand.

AS OF JUNE 30, 2025 THE LOCKBOX HAS \$2.068 MILLION

Since ParkFlag's launch in 2017, the lockbox fund has steadily grown, reinforcing the City's long-term commitment to expanding and enhancing parking resources for the benefit of all users.

# BREAKING DOWN THE TRUE COST OF A PARKING STRUCTURE

As of 2025, the cost of constructing a parking structure can reach as high as \$90,000 per space. Factors like the structure type, location, design complexity, labor costs, materials, and technology can help reduce, or raise this cost per space. When addressing this high cost per space, our \$2.07 million lock box fund may not seem like much.

Strategy to Leverage the Lockbox and Accelerate Development in Flagstaff

#### Financing Approach:

Secure a loan through debt service, with future lockbox funds allocated to cover repayment.

#### **Land Utilization:**

Partner with existing building projects to maximize the use of high-value land for multi-purpose development.

## Community Engagement: In

December 2024, ParkFlag issued an RFIP to the community, inviting developers to submit partnership opportunities.

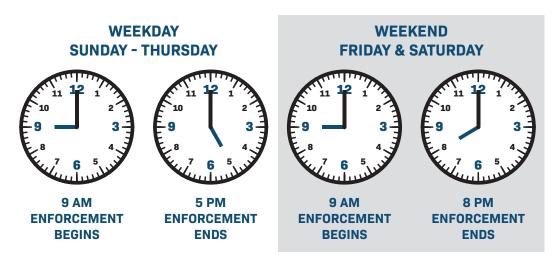
# PARKING DISTRICT METRICS OVERVIEW

Flagstaff receives over 5 million visitors annually. A substantial portion of these visitors spend time in the pay to park downtown area managed by ParkFlag. The Flagstaff Visitor Intercept Study sites that Downtown Flagstaff is the top activity for visitors during their visit. The comprehensive parking program helps manage parking downtown to regulate traffic and improve the overall downtown visitor experience.

### **OCCUPANCY**

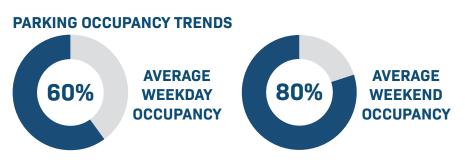
ParkFlag manages approximately 1,036 paid parking spaces, both on-street and off-street, within the ParkFlag District.

A portion of the on-street spaces are available for public Pay-to-Park, using kiosks or mobile app, and by Employee Permit holders. These spaces are regulated and open for general public use during the following hours:



Current occupancy trends show demand for paid parking in the district:

These occupancy trends demonstrate that the Parking District operates near optimal capacity based on industry standards, especially on weekends. This data is used forresource planning, rate adjustments, and potential program expansions.



# WHERE YOU CAN FIND FREE PARKING

ParkFlag continues to provide convenient complimentary parking opportunities to support downtown access and community needs.



#### • Two-Hour Complimentary Parking

Available Monday through Saturday, 7:00 AM - 8:00 PM, at the following locations:

- Route 66, between Humphreys and Verde
- · Cottage Avenue
- · Benton Avenue
- 100 South Humphreys Street

#### • Government Lots

Most government facilities, including the City Hall lot, offer free parking after 5:00 PM on weekdays and all day on weekends.

#### Additional Options

Free parking is available throughout the district before and after enforcement hours. Visitors are encouraged to review posted signage carefully to ensure compliance with any restrictions.

### **MAPS**

ParkFlag's redesigned website features new maps that highlight free parking options, including two-hour spaces, government lots with evening and weekend access, and areas outside the managed district. The maps also outline pay-to-park boundaries and access points, helping visitors park with ease.

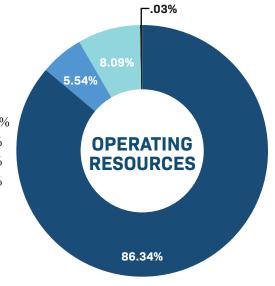

Parking Contributions were one-time funds paid to ParkFlag by Mountain Line for the purchase of parking spaces within the existing Phoenix Avenue lot for the continued construction of the Downtown Connection Center.

These funds will be used to add spaces back into inventory and the full amount was directly deposited into the lockbox.

ParkFlag's largest expenditures reflect the costs of running a safe, efficient, and user-friendly parking system:

#### Salaries & Wages:

Our team includes a Parking Manager, a Lead Parking Aide, and five Parking Aides who handle enforcement, customer service, and day-to-day operations. Staffing is our largest investment, ensuring the community is well served.

#### • Computer Equipment & Software

This essential software supports online parking permit purchases, back-office management, kiosk operations, and all enforcement activities. It helps the program run smoothly and provides a convenient experience for the public.

#### • Credit Card Fees

While these fees are high, they are a necessary cost to process approximately 550,000 transactions each year. They allow customers to pay quickly and securely, supporting modern, flexible payment options.

#### • Debt Service

These payments cover the initial purchase and installation of parking kiosks and district-wide signage. The program is scheduled to pay off this debt by 2027, if not sooner, which will free up additional resources for future improvements.

Together, these investments help ParkFlag manage parking efficiently while maintaining the cleanliness, safety, and character of our community.
